The Presenters: Judith Zimmer is a lawyer, educator, and conflict resolution expert who has co-authored several of Street Law's curricular materials. While at Street Law, she has worked as a teacher trainer and curriculum developer in Northern Ireland, and Nepal. Prior to coming to D.C., Judy ran the Street Law program at the Cleveland-Marshall College of Law, and helped run the law program for Cleveland's Law and Public Service Magnet High School. Deborah Foster directs Street Law initiatives and implements juvenile justice, youth leadership, and legal diversity programs in areas surrounding Washington DC. Deborah has expanded local programs into national and international settings; she took Save Our Streets into Connecticut and implemented the United Kingdom program "Youth Act!" She also leads Street Law's efforts to educate youth about intellectual property.
